# WILL GOD SAVE? ISAIAH 40



## HEAD QUESTIONS

- Take a look at the introduction in a study bible on Isaiah. What does it say about the difference between Isa 1-39 & Isa 40-66?
- As you read through Isa 40 what are some of the attributes of God that come out of the passage?
- What are the similarities and differences between God and idols? How do they compare? (cf. Isa 44:9-20)
- If you were an Israelite in exile what would this passage mean for you? Would it be an encouragement or discouragement?



## HEART QUESTIONS

- How are idols described in this passage? What are some things in your life that you would consider idols?
- Would you describe yourself as a fearful person? If so, how might this passage address your fear?
- Re-read at Isa 40:30-31. Why is it hard to wait on the Lord? What do you think that looks like?



## HAND QUESTIONS

- What are some of the promises that God made to the nation of Israel? How did he fulfill them? What promises has he made to you?
- Go back and reread Isa 40:3-5 and then read Matt 3:1-6. Who was Isaiah talking about? How might recognizing this connection provide you hope?
- Waiting on God involves complete dependence on God and trust in what God will do. Which of these is hardest for you? Why?
- What is one thing that the group can be praying for you during this week?
